



## You will need:

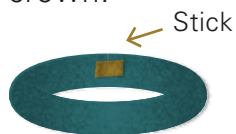
- ◇ 1 x A3 piece of card

- ◇ A pair of scissors

## Did you know...?

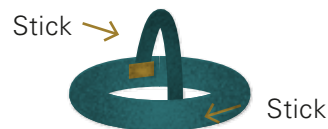
Queen Victoria visited the Bridgewater Canal in 1851. She boarded a royal barge at Patricroft, built by the Earl of Ellesmere to take her along the canal to his home, Worsley New Hall.

Why not go for a walk in one of the Bridgewater Canal's lovely green places once you have made your crown and collect natural treasures to stick on to it e.g. a sparkly stone, feather or a colourful flower.

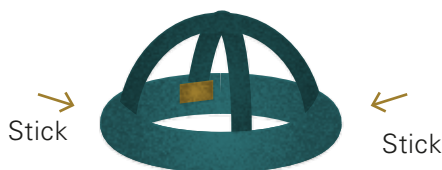
1. Cut out a strip of card. Measure it so it fits your head and then stick the ends together. This is the base of your crown.



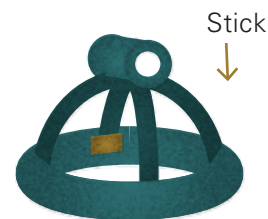
2. Cut out another 2 strips of card, put tape at both ends and stick the first strip to the inside of the crown.



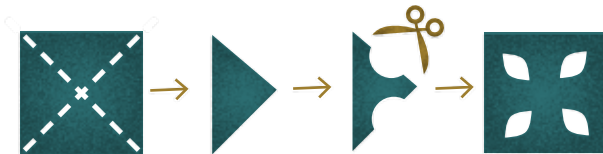
3. Stick the second piece of card to the inside of the crown so that it makes a cross shape with the first.



4. Cut out a rectangle of paper, roll it into a tube and stick it to the top of the crown.



5. Cut out a small square, fold it along the diagonals cut out 2 semi circles on the folded edges and unfold the paper.



6. Stick the square on top of the tube shape. And there you have your completed crown!
